

## HEROIC ITALIANS BRAVELY FIEE!

Report when the Provincial Junta of Catalonia.

From Capt. Carlos don Attfield.

'Yesterday the (expletive deleted) French and their allies tried to run a wagon of supplies Militia and 'de Basta Bandido' from their to one of their isolated garrisons. From wounded captives it would appear that a Lt. Giacomo Wallman, with 10 Dalmations (in Green coats, not white with black spots!) and Sgt. D. Titus, with 9 Italians, were escorting, sorry escorted, by a civilian with a cart. Following on was Sgt. Giavanni Davis, with 9 Italians, and Sgt. Eric Saignée, with 9 Frogs. Titus drove the guerilleros in front of him and they

Cell back across the stream to join the Militia. In following up the Italians were driven off by this combined force, leaving one of their number bathing in the stream. Recieving very heavy casualties, the Dal--mations fled from in front of my men and raced back over the bridge. However, now Sgts. Davis and Saignee were making an appearance. Up to this point Lt. Wallman had been seen running round in ever de--creasing circles, and is assumed to have beet suffering from some form of Brain Fever.

Roberto White now appeared to help us and occupied the village. The Dalmations and the Italians under Sgt. Titus were hurriedly reorganised and herded forward by threats and curses by Lt. Wallman, and drove the position, but the fell back in good order and re-grouped on the hill behind them, and the Eyeties could not shift them, no matter how they tried.

Meanwhile, Sgt. Davis, followed by Sgt Saignée, attacked my position. In the firefight that followed, I bravely fired my pistol at Sgt Davis. I missed. We then retired, supported by Augiers men, in excellent order to the cover of the village. Davis and Saignee prepared their assault. It was then that an uplifting experience happened. Father Frenetico, the local priest rallied the villagers and led them in a gallant charge against the foriegners. The Eyeties, being confronted by a huge banner depicting the Madona and child, debated whether to fire, or kneel reverently and then fire. In the end it took two volleys and a stiff hand to hand fight, lasting at least 2 seconds, to defeat the brave peasants. After some nasty fighting, and some hurled abused through open windows, Lt. Wallman took stock of the situation, and his remaining troops, and decided to retire. He will no doubt make another attempt with more men soon.

Our casualties were 19 out of 51 and 14 out of 19 peasants. French and Italian casualties were 17 out of 41.
